The book of Esther shares a story with us of two ladies, two queens. One was already queen; the other would soon replace her. One lost favor with the king; the other obtained his favor. Why was it that Vashti lost her position as queen? The answer is simple. She refused to come at the King's bidding. There is speculation as to why she didn't come but what reason she had was not reason enough for the king. Because of her refusal to obey his command, she lost her prestige's position.

The king in the story of Esther could represent the Lord and the two ladies could represent the world and the church. The King has summonsed us to come to Him and while some prepare themselves, others balk, and make excuse as to why they're not doing what it is that the King is asking them to do.

The Bible says, "There is no matter hid from the King." When we stand before Him, our preparation or our lack of preparation is going to be revealed.

The Bible lets us know that our King is coming back for a bride who has made herself ready.
